Thai cave rescue in June and July 2018 astonished the world. It showed 27 difficult the task was to save a group of 12 boys and their soccer coach from a cave in Thailand. The rescue team had no way to communicate with the boys inside. The boys inside could face the threat of death because they stayed in the cave too long and might not breathe normally. 28, the monsoon rains were likely to flood the cave again, which forced the rescue team to race against time.

To reach the boys, the divers of the rescue team had to make a two-and-a-half mile 29 through the dark waters and narrow passages. With numerous efforts, they eventually led each boy out, one by one, and carried all of them to dry land. Swimsuit competition has been the focus of the Miss America pageant since 1921 when it was held on the Atlantic City boardwalk. However, what the candidates wore at that time was not bikinis, but one-piece bathing suits, which were conservative by today's standards. But gradually it became women in bikinis and high heels walking around in the swimsuit competition for attracting a television audience.

Over the decades, the Miss America Organization struggled to strike a balance between its mission "empowering women" and its "tradition," requiring candidates to wear bikinis. In fact, it was hard for audience and people to believe that wearing bikinis has something to do with "empowering women." Obviously, this assertion was not acceptable for most people. Some former candidates had spoken out against the swimsuit competition, saying it led to serious physical and mental problems.

Gretchen Carlson, the new chair of the Miss America Organization, mentioned that she once had talked to tons of young ladies and they told her, "I'd love to be a part of that program, but I don't want to parade and walk around in a swimsuit." And Carlson responded on June 5, 2018 on ABC's Good Morning America, "We are not going to judge you on your outward appearance. We are moving it forward and evolving it in this cultural revolution." The new competition would definitely focus more on the candidate's talents, intelligence, and ideas, rather than how she would look in a swimsuit. "So guess what? You don't have to do that anymore. You're welcome. Please come join us!" Carlson said.

The life of astronauts in the space station is never easy. In fact, it can be very unpredictable. There is no gravity. To get ready for all the possibilities in space, astronauts should go through a **tough** training program. As NASA astronaut Ricky Arnold mentions, "We train every day. And things can change quickly up there. We need to be prepared."

The ISS (The International Space Station) is a giant flying space laboratory operated by the United States, Russia, Japan, Europe, and Canada. It is the size of a football field. Astronauts from around the world can live and work together. The training program covers many subjects, from astronomy, geology to photography. "Astronauts also learn about all the science experiments they will be doing in space," says Tamara York, a training officer at NASA.

One of the most difficult tasks for astronauts is going outside the station to do repairs. Practicing for how to walk in space is a key part of training. Therefore, astronauts spend time in Neutral Buoyancy Lab in Houston. It is the world's largest indoor pool. The conditions there are close to **those** in space. While diving, astronauts wear the space suit they would wear on a spacewalk.

"Very critical things can occur, and astronauts need to be ready," says York. All kinds of emergencies can happen in space and that is the reason why the training focuses on preparing for problems that might come up in space. For instance, an astronaut must learn what to do if there is a fire. Arnold has even completed the training at a hospital emergency room because "If you need stitches, it is going to be you or your buddies doing it for you," Arnold says.
