Walking along the streets, you will see some stores with many claw machines inside. These claw machines are perfect for vending small toys, candies, and other small prizes. What the player needs to do is to insert coins or tokens into a machine and move the claw back, forth, and sideways for a certain amount of time. If the player is successful, the prize the claw is holding is dropped into the opening for collection. If not, it's game over.

Claw machines become a sudden hit in Taiwan because this business model is simple for those who want to be their own boss. They just rent a small place from the store owner and place claw machines. They do not need to struggle with many things beforehand, such as running proposals, raising money, hiring employees and managing them. Buying a claw machine usually costs them about NT\$ 30,000. The average cost for renting a place is about NT\$ 5,000. The total fixed cost is NT\$ 35,000. It is said that the average monthly income for an individual machine makes around NT\$ 10,000 profit at a good location. Some even say that they can start making up to NT\$150,000 in revenue every month afterward. Therefore, it is a low risk investment.

Even though running a claw machine business may make profits, the overall “claw machine phenomenon” does cause some concern. Psychiatrists warn of dangers of “claw machine addiction,” saying that many players became so addicted that they ran out of money and ended up ruining their life. Economists claim that claw machines first emerged during the Great Depression; it is indicative of an economy in recession and regarded as a warning sign. So next time when you grab the toy or gadget of your choosing, tell yourself: “Claw machines can't fulfill any part of yourself; instead, they may make you addicted and lose dreams.”
