Recently the word “job scam” has already become one of the most googled keywords across the globe. It seems that people everywhere in the world are quite eager to find out whatever they can about this illegal activity. The main reason may be that the Internet nowadays has become **rife** with various kinds of job scams. Additionally, experts have observed that job scams have been commonly seen on the Internet since the COVID-19 pandemic. For instance, from 2020 to 2021 job scams reported to the U.S. government almost tripled. Similarly in the U.K., job scams in 2020 increased by 88%, compared with 2019. One possible explanation, according to experts, is that as the COVID-19 crisis has made it more difficult to find a decent job, lots of people simply jump at whatever job opportunities they can find, without making sure whether or not they are real.

Besides, the way job scammers operate is almost the same around the world: first, they create a fake job ad that usually looks legitimate. When a jobseeker falls for it, the so-called company will attempt to steal his or her personal and financial information. After they manage to do so, they may go further, cheating a great deal of money out of the jobseeker in a number of clever ways (e.g., they may ask him or her to pay a fortune for some expensive goods and try to resell them to their fake client that doesn't exist at all!) Moreover, if it is the worst kind of job scam, the jobseeker may be kidnapped and end up as a victim in the notorious human-trafficking business!

Some may wonder if it is possible that all the nations on earth might work together to fight job scam crimes, now that they are being committed worldwide. Well, let's just say that some joint effort has been made. For example, the EU set up the European Anti-Fraud Office in 1999, aiming to investigate Europe's fraudulent activities, including job scams. But when it comes to a well-coordinated, cross-continental campaign against job scams, there's still so much that remains to be done!
