In recent years, rideable suitcases have become increasingly popular across various countries in Asia, partly due to the influence of celebrities like Paris Hilton and Shilpa Shetty. These motorized suitcases,

26 are powered by lithium-ion batteries and work like children's scooters, are trendy and convenient. In Japan, 27, riding these motorized suitcases is not allowed. Japanese traffic laws classify these suitcases as electric scooters if they have a 50 cc engine or less and can reach a certain speed. This means that riding them without safety gear or a driver's license is illegal. 28, last year, a Chinese woman in her 30s was accused of riding a three-wheeled suitcase on the sidewalk without a license in Osaka. 29 such legal issues, two major airports in Japan have now forbidden the use of motorized luggage within their facilities. 

Dubai plans to launch electric flying taxis by 2026, marking a major step in the future of urban transportation. The city's Roads and Transport Authority (RTA) has partnered with Joby Aviation, a leading company specializing in electric aircraft. These new air taxis will be fully electric, designed to carry four passengers along with a pilot, and will reach speeds of up to 320 km/h.

(②)

The flying taxis will take off and land at special places named vertiports, strategically located at Dubai International Airport (DXB), Downtown Dubai, Dubai Marina, and Palm Jumeirah. This service aims to significantly reduce travel time across the city; for example, a trip from Palm Jumeirah to DXB, which usually takes 45 minutes by car, will only take about 12 minutes by air taxi.

The aircraft are equipped with six small fan blades, making them quieter than a helicopter, with noise levels similar to light rainfall. Large windows offer a **panoramic** outlook of the city during the flight, allowing passengers to enjoy a 360-degree sight of Dubai's iconic skyline and landmarks. While the exact price hasn't been announced, it's expected to be similar to a premium ride service like Uber Black, costing around \$75 for certain routes.

Joby Aviation, already a partner of Uber, may make it possible for passengers to book their air taxi rides directly through the Uber app. Safety is a primary focus, and the air taxis have undergone extensive testing, including over 60,000 kilometers of safe test flights. More testing will continue before the official launch to ensure a smooth and safe experience for the public. With this ambitious project, Dubai is taking a big leap towards reducing road traffic and offering a faster, eco-friendly travel option in the city.

The *Climate Change Scientific Report 2024*, published by the National Science and Technology Council and the Ministry of Environment in May, outlines serious concerns about Taiwan's future if global warming is out of control. (①) The report warns that if greenhouse gas emissions are not effectively reduced, Taiwan could face summers lasting up to seven months, with a significant rise in the number of days exceeding 36°C. This prolonged heat could increase health risks and intensify the urban heat island effect, making cities even hotter. Additionally, the report predicts a rise in sea levels, which could cause major flooding in areas such as Yunlin, Tainan, Changhua, and Keelung, with some regions facing water levels over two meters deep. Agricultural production is also at risk, with key crops like rice and corn expected to see significant yield reductions by mid-century due to higher temperatures. (②)

The ecological impact is equally alarming. The suitable altitude for natural forests will go up by 173 meters, reducing the area where many species can thrive. Marine life is also threatened, with sea temperatures above 33-34°C disturbing seagrass growth. The number of ocean creatures is expected to decline considerably starting in 2030. (③) The report also highlights the increased frequency of extreme weather events, such as droughts and intense rainfall, which will complicate water resource management and disaster preparedness. (④) These findings emphasize the urgent need for both relief and adaptation strategies to address the growing threat of climate change in Taiwan.
